

OBITUARY - BARRY JONES 1958—2013

Barry Jones, or Baz as he was known to his family and friends, loved his cattle. He lived at 'Bangalla', a 250 acre farm in the Southern Highlands of NSW and there he bred Maine-Anjou cattle. His favourite time of day was late afternoon when he would get in his truck and slowly patrol the paddocks, spending time just looking at "who's who in the zoo" as he described it.

Baz was born in Camperdown in 1958 to Ted and Noelie Jones. Ted passed away when Baz was 8 years old and he never forgot the loss of his father. Baz and his mother moved to Leichhardt and then to Balmain where Baz was a student at Ibrox Boys' High School. As a teenager he excelled at sports playing both rugby league and rugby union. He later played Union with the Drummoyne "Dirty Reds'. Baz was a fanatical West Tigers fan always staying true to his Balmain roots.

As a young man he aspired to get ahead in life and following his first job at Grace Bros Travel in Roselands he moved into the financial world eventually becoming a very successful stockbroker.

In 1987 he married Sandy and they became proud parents of three sons: Bryn, Owen and Huw. It was at this time that Baz and Sandy bought "Bangalla" and Baz began breeding cattle, initially beginning with Murray Greys and then specialising in the Maine-Anjou breed.

Baz travelled to Canada to source the genetics for his cattle and over the following decades he built one of the finest stud herds in Australia and New Zealand. He was successful in winning many prizes including Grand Champion Female at the Royal Melbourne Show in 1992, Reserve Senior Champion at the Sydney Royal Easter Show in 1992 and Grand Champion Bull at the Sydney Royal Easter Show in 2011.

He made a major contribution to the genetics of the Maine-Anjou Society and these genetics will be passed on to the young farmers to honour and continue Baz's work.

In 2008 Baz travelled with his partner, Susan, to the Loire Valley to attend the Maine Anjou conference at Gontier. He enjoyed his time there immensely and came home with many happy memories of the people he met in France, the cattle he inspected and the excellent local wines and fine food he appreciated so much.

Baz was a larger- than- life character, a big man who liked room to move. He had a great sense of humour and was a wonderful host. He had a wide range of eclectic interests including art, opera, ancient history and travelling the world.

Baz is survived by his partner Susan, his three sons Bryn, Owen and Huw and his former wife, Sandy.
